- Students were asked to prepare a lecture on some topics and record his/her presentation and upload videos on google classrooms. Students were evaluated on the classrooms and received feedbacks.
- Starting from 15 March on which study was suspended because of Corona pandemic, the scheduled lectures and laboratories were delivered to the students through telegram channel created by faculty vice dean office.


